Please bring the following documents with you when being admitted:

- Any available MRI and/or X-ray images
- Your signed surgery agreement
- Any relevant medical reports, blood group ID, etc.
- Photo ID
- List of medications
- Personal items
- E-Card (Austrian insurance card, if available)
- Crutches (if available)
- Athletic shoes for physical therapy

Preparing for surgery at home:

→ Start the Octenisan Set preoperative cleansing process 5 days prior to surgery.

Please note:

Do not shave the skin around the area to be operated on for 10 days before the operation.

Shaving can cause minor skin injuries, which can be a contraindication for surgery.

Admitting time as discussed with the surgical planning team.

Please report to the Confraternität Hospital reception.

They will accompany you to be admitted and then to your ward.

Once you have been shown to your room, the preoperative exams will begin:

- Blood testing: (complete blood count, coagulation, HIV test, and hepatitis serology)
- EKG
- lung X-ray (depending on age)
- Medical examination for surgery clearance

You will be informed of your expected surgery time at the ward; however, we ask for your understanding that the exact time of surgery may shift due to medical and/or organizational reasons.

Before the procedure, Dr. Gäbler will visit you again, on the day of the operation.
